Visegrad Fund in a nutshell

- Founded in 2000 by the Declaration of the V4 Prime Ministers
- Mission: to strengthen the ties of the V4 and to develop the cooperation between their non governmental institutions in the field of culture, education, science and research, tourism, cross border cooperation and youth exchange
- Desicion-making: CA-CM unanimous
- Budget: 8 million, 10 mil. from 2022 on
- Seat: Bratislava

Supporting mobility of people and ideas: €102M of approved funding






V4+ Grants in the Western Balkans, Eastern Partnership and other non-V4 countries: 20% of IVF grants

6000 grant projects implemented and almost 3000 individual scholars and residents supported










Bachelor, Master and post-Master students and researchers in all disciplines and in any language for up to four semesters at more than 190 higher education institutions across Central Europe, Western Balkans and Eastern Partnership. In 2020, to 143 scholars support for 300 semesters in total amount of €1.200,000 was granted.


